MINUTES – MONARCH COVE BOARD OF DIRECTORS September 23, 2017

President Jim Benz called the meeting to order at 9:05 a.m. on Saturday June 24, 2017 at the home of Secretary Gladys Shultz. Board members, officers and Committee Chairs present were: Gladys Shultz, Debbie Earleywine, Fred Shultz, Sandra Bowman, Kristin Jacobi, Tim Kennedy, Allan Sieck, Warren Vickery, Mark Lemke, Rod Earleywine and Jim Benz. Absent was Dan Bennett. Also present were members Todd Murphy, Bob Aure and Jinny Sloan Perrin.

President Benz asked for a motion to approve minutes of the June 26, 2017 and the July 29, 2017 meetings of the board of directors.

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Upon motion made by Allan Sieck and seconded by Warren Vickery, the minutes of the June 26, 2017 meeting were approved.

Upon motion made by Sandra Bowman and seconded by Mark Lemke, the minutes of the July 29, 2017 meeting were approved.

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Jim Benz advised the board that Brian Gilmore of Town & Country Tree Service has agreed to charge Monarch Cove the following reduced rate for tree work:

- \$125.00 per hour;
- \$50 per dump load;
- \$2.50 per inch to remove stumps if Monarch Cove does the cleans up; and
- \$4.50 per inch to remove stumps if Town & Country Tree Service does the clean-up.

Jim advised the Board that for most Monarch Cove jobs, Town & Country Tree Service would also provide a cap bid that would set a maximum charge for each job. When there is a cap bid, Jim said that the Town & Country Tree Service charge will be based upon the time expended on the job, but not to exceed the cap bid.

Jim advised the board that the following tree work needs to be completed before Spring (The cap bid is set out below each item) :

- 1. Remove dead branches/limbs in the green space east of maintenance shed and over maintenance shed
 - a. Cap bid--\$612.50
 - i. 4.5 hours
 - ii. 1 dump load
- 2. Remove dead branches/limbs that are hanging over Park Avenue
 - a. Cap bid--\$287.50
 - i. 2 hours
 - ii. .75 dump load
- 3. Remove the dead oak tree on the North edge of the Park and remove the 30 inch stump, with stump clean-up by Town & Country Tree Service
 - a. Cap bid--\$1,485
 - i. 10 hours
 - ii. 2 dump loads
 - iii. Stump removal with cleanup

Jim advised the Board that in an effort to fight the Two Lined Chestnut Boer, it is important that Monarch Cove remove as much dead wood as possible. It was moved by Kristin Jacobi and seconded by Debbie Earleywine that the board authorize the work set out in the Town and Country bid. The motion was approved by the board.

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Monarch Cove Treasurer and Finance Committee Chairman, Fred Shultz, reviewed Monarch Cove's financial transactions and status since the last Board meeting and answered all questions addressed to him by the Board. Upon motion made and duly seconded, the board approved the Financial Report.

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Marina Chairman, Rod Earleywine, made the following presentation to the Board:

The Marina committee met on Saturday, September 9, 2017 and discussed possible changes/improvements for the south marina. The 3 main areas of concerns from our yearly camp meeting were the following:

- 4. The swimming dock was not as long as in previous years.
- 5. The swimming dock needs to match up with the angle of the steps (needs to be angled more to the south.
- 6. The marina dock and the swim dock are too close together.

The committee agreed and decided to implement changes for the 2018 season. On September 20, 2017, I received a letter from the DNR stating that the south docks were not in compliance. Specifically the following issues:

- 1. The docks must be at least 10 ft apart.
- 2. The docks can't be connected with a walkway as they are now. They must be separate.
- 3. The "T" on the swim dock is 32 ft. long when only a 24 ft. "T" is allowed.
- 4. The canoe deck is not allowed in its current configuration.

Addressing Marina concerns and finding Marina solutions:

1. The swim dock is currently 128 ft long and that is the length we are permitted for through the DNR so that is the length it will be for the

2018 season.

- 2. The Swim dock will be angled more to the south so it aligns with the steps. I will meet with Don Johnson (North Bay Docks) so that he knows what we want.
- 3. The "T" will need to be shortened to 24 ft. for eh 2018 season. I will also discuss this with Don Johnson.
- 4. The marina dock will be moved to the south and the docks will not be connected.
- 5. The boats will enter the lifts from the south, as they currently do, ensuring that the lifts are at least 5 ft from Monarch Coves southern property line.
- 6. I will meet with the DNR to ensure we are in compliance concerning a deck for the canoes.

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Warren Vickery and Mark Lemke discussed a meeting they had with Keith Gibson of Tri-State Paving in Estherville, Iowa concerning Monarch Cove's road project that is tentatively scheduled to begin in the Spring of 2019. Warren and Mark said they also discussed with Keith Gibson the road patches that need to be completed prior to the main road project.

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Ravine Chairwoman, Debbie Earleywine, provided the Board with the following update on Phase 2 of the Ravine/Lake Restoration project:

As per recent conversations with Steve Hassel (Hassel Landscaping) and Jim Blum (Project Designer), the Phase 2 of the Ravine/Lake Restoration project will start in mid-to-late October 2017 and will take approximately one month to complete. Total cost for the project is \$38,178. The Dickinson County Water Quality Commission (aka WQC) will provide funds of \$37,178 (half of which is available in October 2017 and the other half in April 2018). Okoboji Camp Owners Cooperative will be responsible for \$1,600 (monies that are currently available in our Ravine fund). Plantings for the project, which are also covered in the Water Quality Commission funds, will not take place until Spring 2018.
