





Gardening Did you know our very own Betty Lemke was a Master Gardener for 15 years? I know she's the person I go to for gardening advice, though my questions are usually "Hey Betty, what can I plant that I can't kill?" I recently sat down with Betty for some tips and tricks as we look forward to spring gardening. Keep in mind much of this applies to NW lowa weather.

- 1. Mid-March: Prune bushes above the joint, but do not prune blooming shrubs, such as lilacs and forsythias, until after they've bloomed.
- 2. Mid-May to Late-June: Plant set plants (annuals). You can mix annuals and perennials for display and transfer perennials in the fall.
- 3. Fall: Plant perennials. Mulch and water them until the ground freezes.
- 4. In NW lowa buy perennials rated at zones 1-4. Zone 5 is too hit-and-miss in our lakes area and you want your perennials to live! You will find this info on the plant tag.
- 5. Always keep the tags that accompany the plants. Get a notebook to create a garden journal and tape or staple the tags in it so you always know how to take care of them.
- 6. Annuals are often on sale the week before Memorial Day and July 4th.
- 7. Human and dog hair in your garden can help keep plant-eating critters away and will eventually break down as mulch.

**Fiber** By now you should have received information in the mail regarding the installment of fiber optic in Monarch Cove. **Sewers** We had to have our sewers cleaned out again, they were full of toilet paper that didn't break down. Make sure you are only using toilet paper that is SEPTIC-SAFE. It is expensive to have to have the sewers cleaned out constantly. Many brands offer septic-safe toilet paper. Thanks!

# An Ounce of Prevention...

**Safety while Shoveling** Did you know the cold increases heart rate & blood pressure, and constricts arteries, decreasing blood supply? This is why relatively inactive individuals are at greater risk for a heart attack while shoveling, especially those over 40. Shoveling can mean moving hundreds of pounds; to stay safe this winter, follow these basic guidelines, and remember if you have a history of heart disease, get your doctor's ok first.

- 1. Take it slow and stretch out before you begin.
- 2. Try to shovel only fresh, powdery snow; it's lighter and some of this can be done using a leaf blower.
- 3. Push the snow rather than lifting it & if you have to lift, only partially fill a small shovel.
- 4. Lift with your legs, not your back.
- 5. Do not work to the point of exhaustion.
- 6. Know the signs of a heart attack, and stop *immediately* and call 911 if you're experiencing any of them; every minute counts!
